Fish Welfare Initiative (FWI) reduces the suffering of farmed fishes by researching and executing welfare interventions.



Breaking new ground

We make progress in the most challenging areas of the animal movement: farmed fishes, working with farmers, and working in India and China.



Unique, farmer-centric approach

We are one of the few organizations working with farmers-currently 75 of them-to directly improve welfare conditions on the farm.



Local movement growth

In 3 years we have built a team of 20, of whom most are Indian, half are from local regions, and most haven't been involved in the movement previously.

2022 Key Achievements

- Improved the lives of 720,000 fishes (total: 1.14M).
- Transitioned 52 additional fish farms to higherwelfare practices (total: 89).
- Research: Developed our Version 2 Welfare Standard (expected to be more impactful & scalable).
- <u>Signed</u> 2 additional MOUs with Indian corporations to trial higher-welfare fish.
- Policy: Andhra Pradesh Fisheries Department formally recognized FWI to provide input on policies.
- China: Co-hosted first-ever Aquatic Animal Welfare Forum at World Conference on Farm Animal Welfare.
- **Philippines**: <u>Completed</u> 6-month farmer program.

2023 Key Goals

- Improve the lives of additional 1.5M fishes.
- Transition a net additional 150 farms to higher-welfare practices.
- Research: Test our Version 2 Standard such that we are ≥75% confident that it is sufficiently impactful and implementable at scale.
- Corporate: Secure 3 additional commitments and conduct 2 trial runs.
- Policy: Ensure 1 Indian state government passes mandate to improve water quality.
- China: Submit 2 species-specific welfare standards to the Chinese standards authority.
